**Kotilava – Hemvett is a part of the Open Science and Research initiative funded by the Ministry of Education and Culture.**

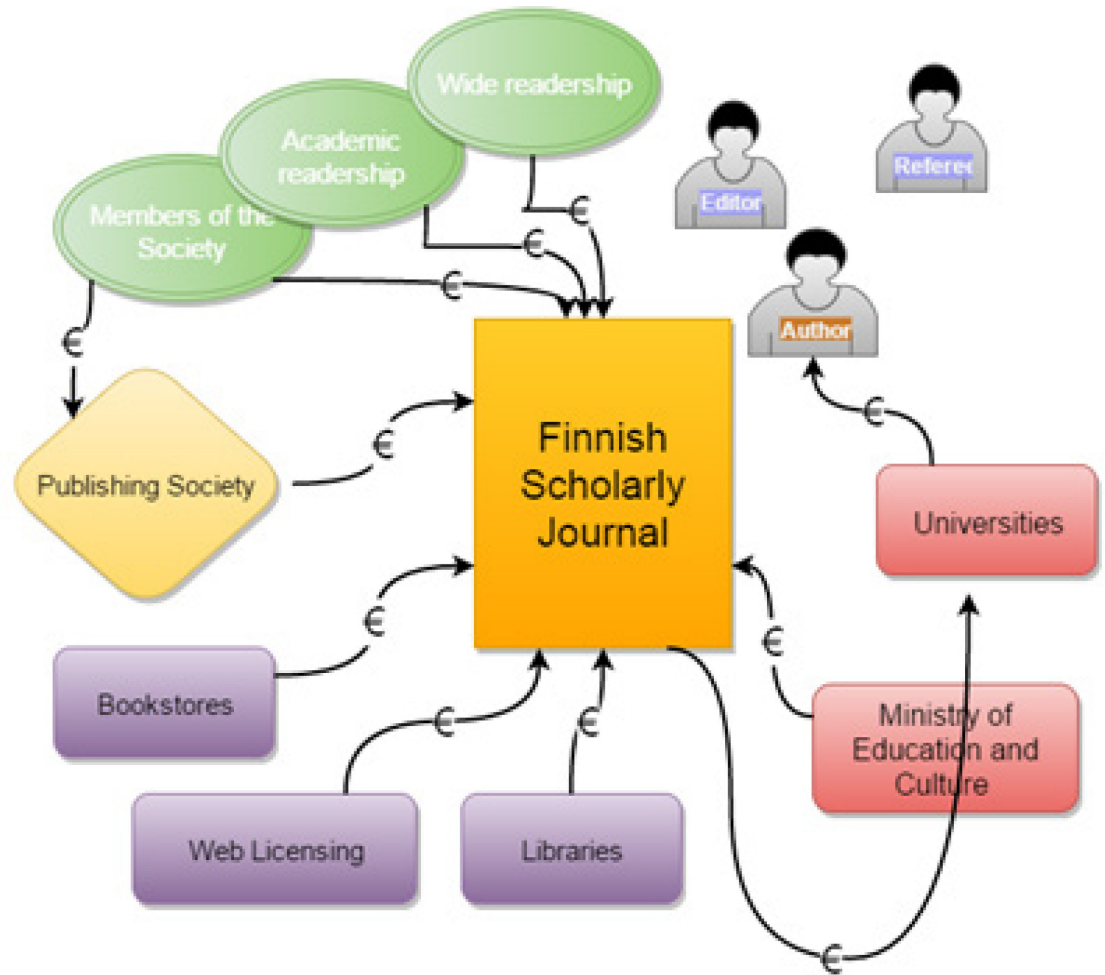
**Vol. I: Improve the tools used in editing and publishing by developing Open Journal Systems (OJS), started in September 2015, Finnish Federation of Learned Societies.**

**Vol. II: Create a sustainable and reasonable funding model for Finnish OA-journals, The National Library of Finland, started in March 2016.**

- Ministry of Education and Culture

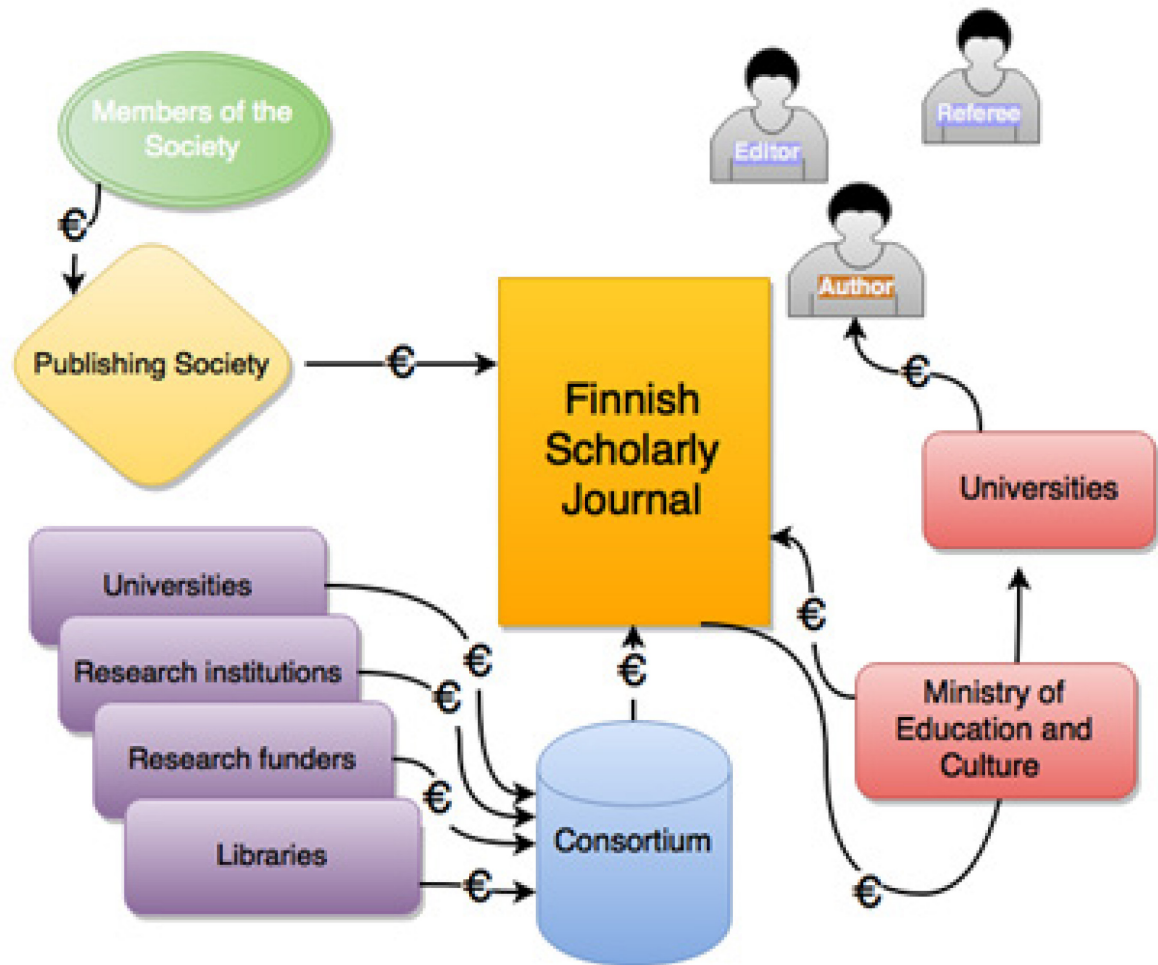

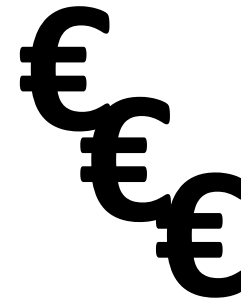
# Expenses & incomes 2014

In 2014, the Ministry of Education and Culture supported 89 journals.

Expenses were (average) 23 670 €.

Incomes were (average) 21 224 €.

Total expenses were 2 106 713 €



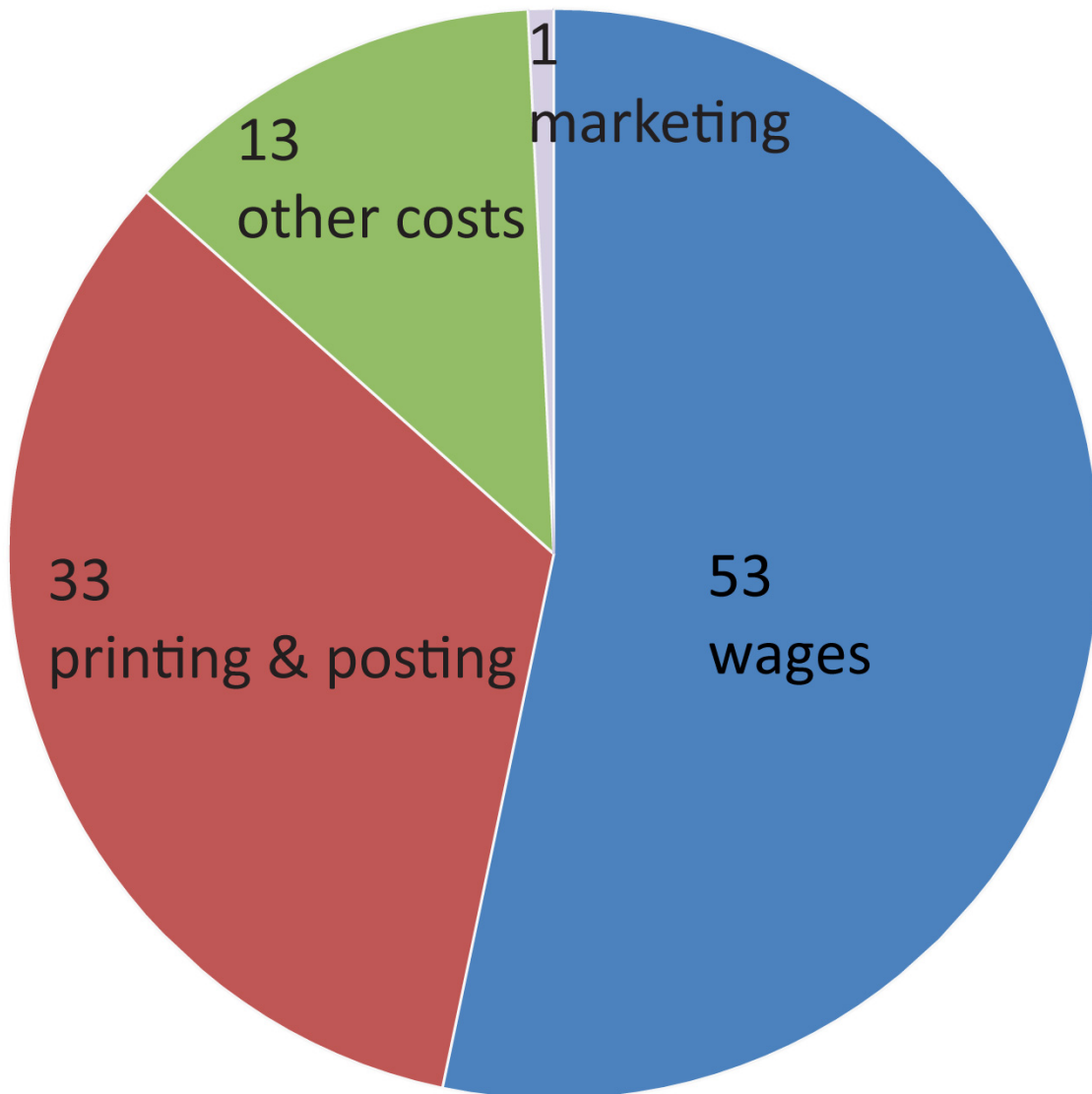
Amount of the published articles was 1 383. The price of one peer-reviewed article was 1 523 €.

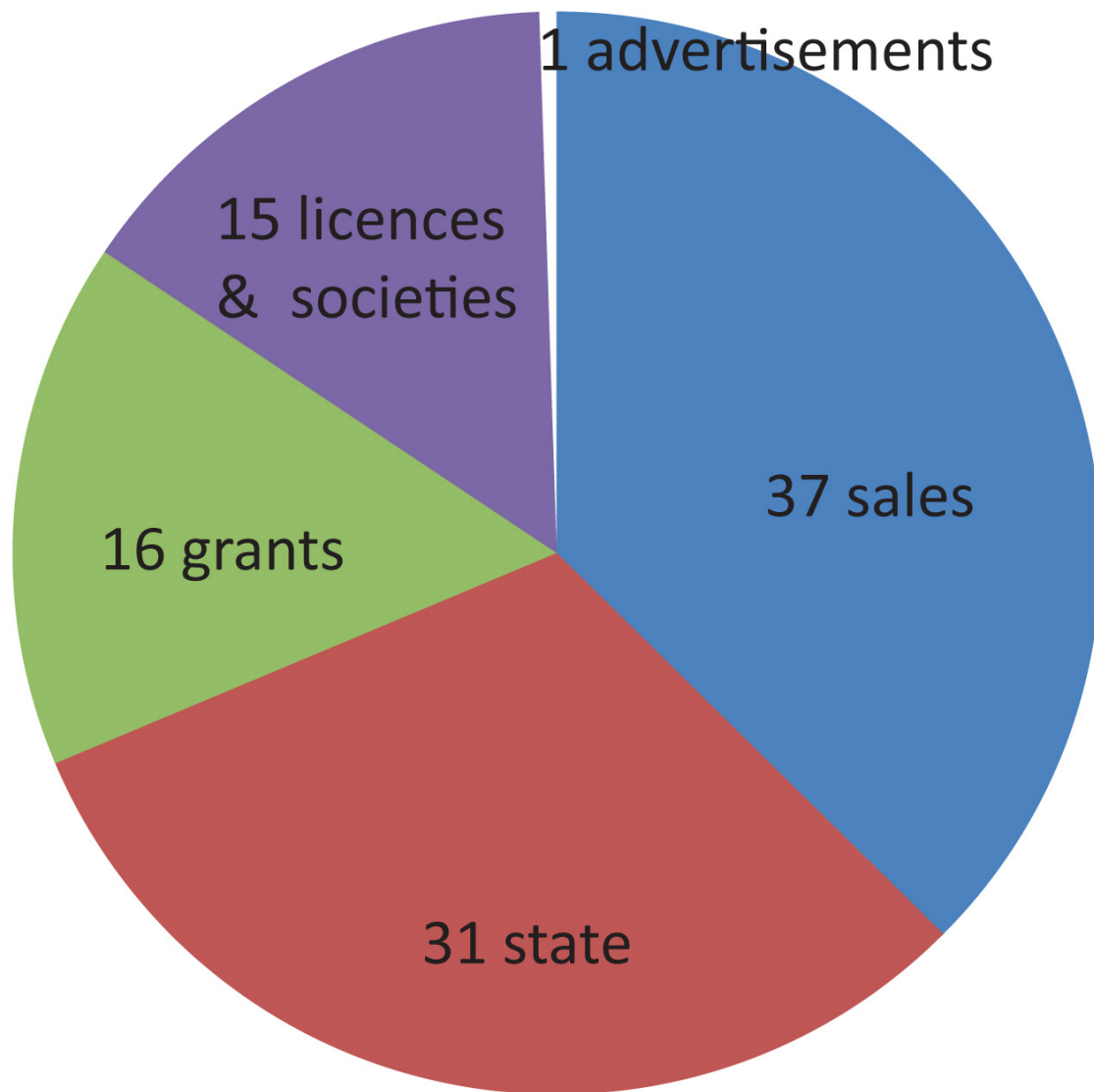

# Why now?

**OA is becoming a standard for academic publishing.**

**Funders have started to insist that the results of the research they give money should be published in OA.**

**Incomes gathered from subscription fees have been diminishing, and the tendency seems to continue.**
